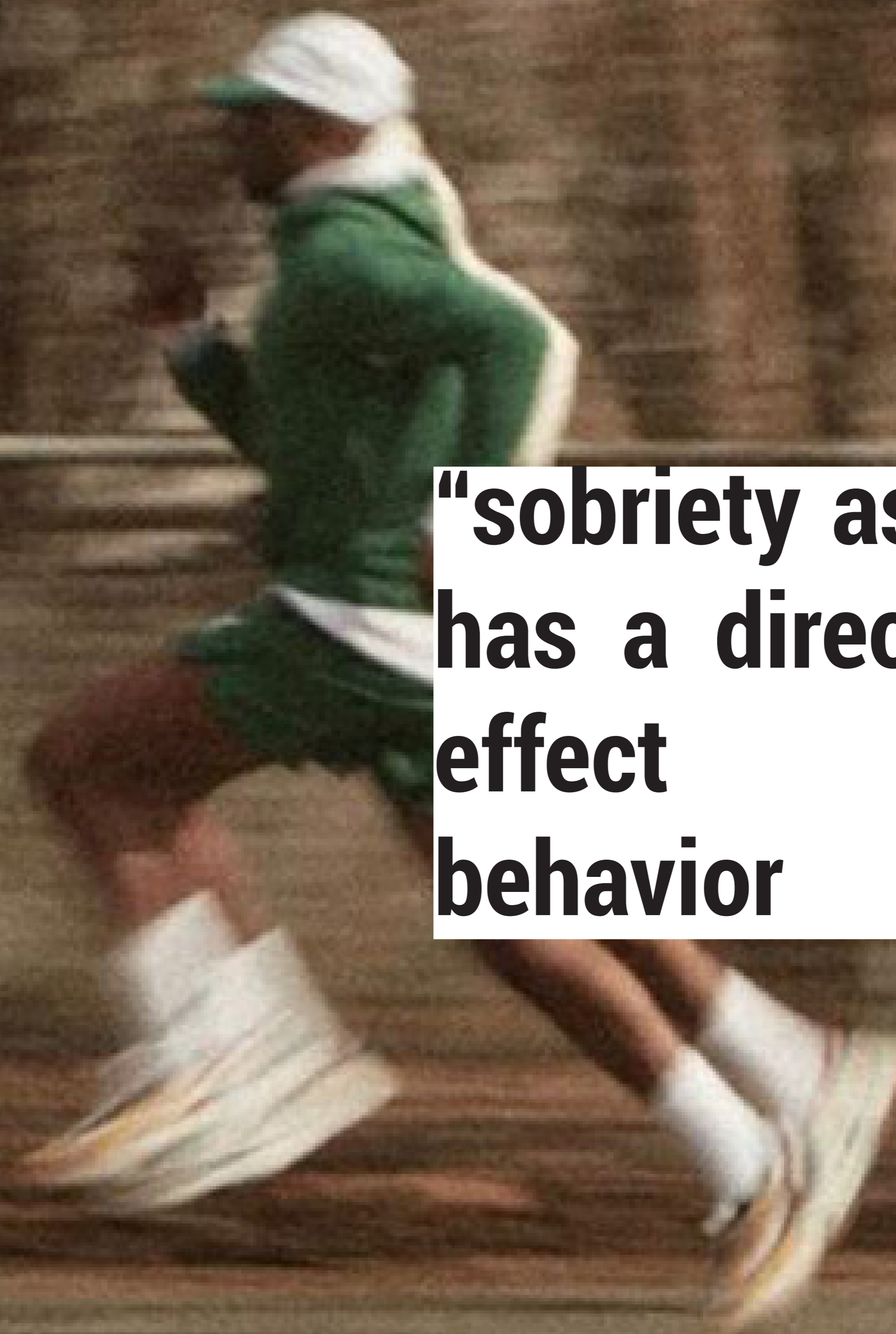




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The Dominance of Value in the 2025 Fashion Equation

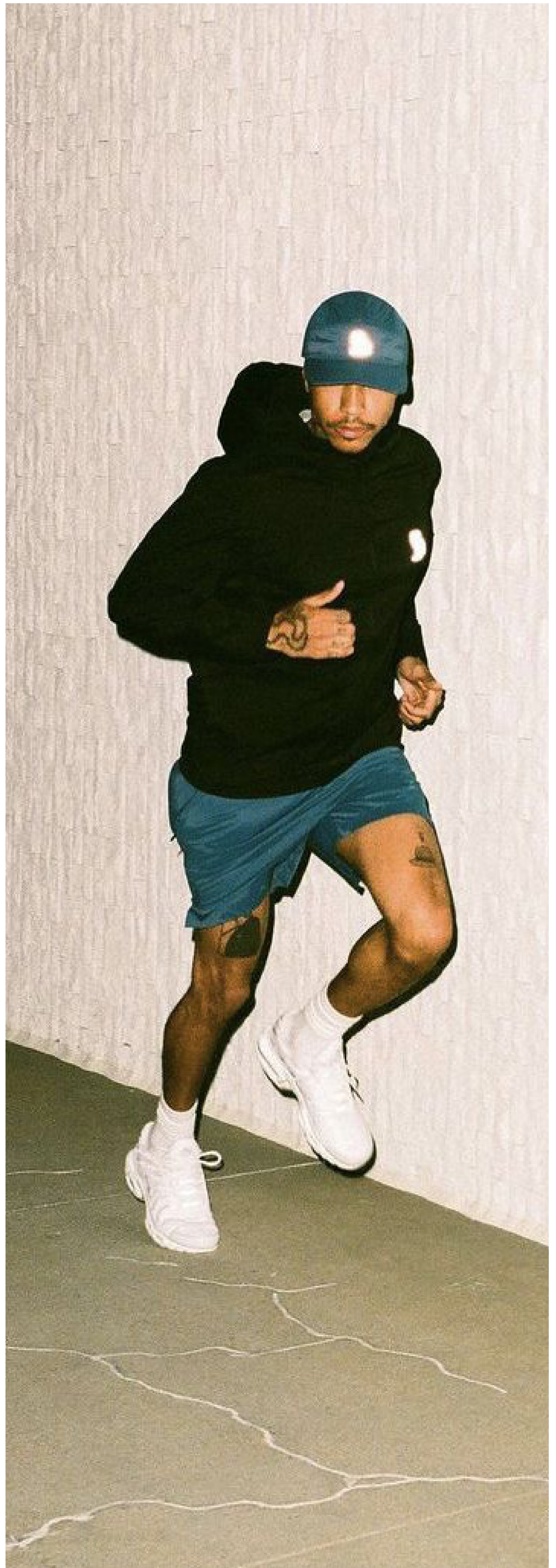
QuietLuxury(StealthWealth) as the Sober Uniform
